Dear Friends of Paterson's Gundagai Vineyard

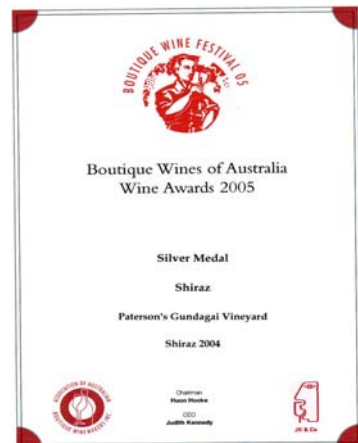
This year has been our most successful year ever in wine shows with our wines winning 3 trophies, 1 gold medal, 1 silver medal and 6 bronze medals.

The 2004 Shiraz:

When this wine was bottled earlier this year, we knew we were on to something special. The wine is deep purple and spicy and has an incredibly long palate. Evidence of the quality of the wine came early with the wine ranking 3rd out of about 160 Shiraz wines in the National Boutique wine of Australia wine awards – also winning a silver medal at that show.

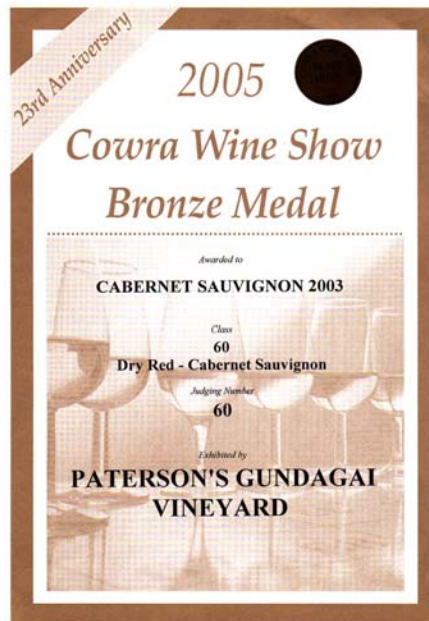
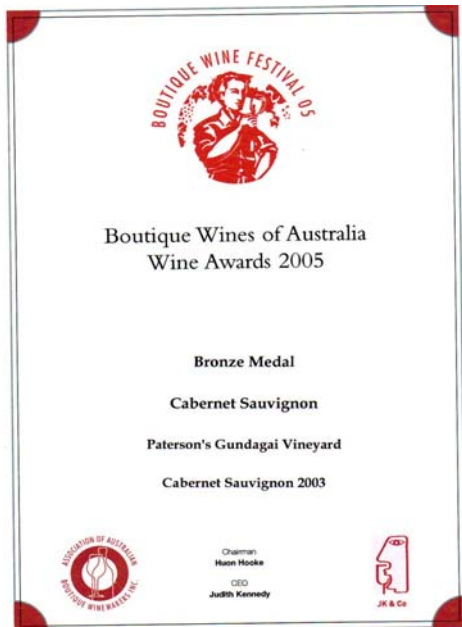
The icing on the cake was when our 2004 Shiraz won a gold medal and three trophies (Best red wine, Best Shiraz and Best red wine from a boutique producer) at the NSW small winemakers wine show. This ranked our Shiraz as the best red out of more than 270 red wines in NSW – including many from famous brands from the Hunter, Hill Tops, Canberra, Mudgee and Orange.

This outstanding wine will continue to improve over the next 5 years.



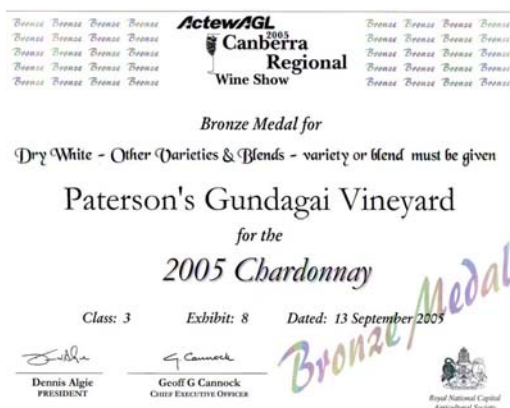
The 2003 Cabernet Sauvignon:

Has continued its show success winning 2 more bronze medals this year bringing its total tally to 4. This wine has matured well and will continue to improve over the next 5 years.



The 2005 Chardonnay:

Our 1st Gundagai Chardonnay is approx 30% fermented in French oak and exhibits a creamy, nutty, peachy aroma with underlying fruit concentration. It won a bronze medal at the 2005 Canberra Regional Wine Show and will develop over the next few years.



We still have limited stocks of the 2001 Cabernet Sauvignon (bronze medal) and the 2003 Shiraz (2 silver medals).
